AS WE GATHER Sundays are not included in the numbering of the forty days of Lent. So you've made it through the first ten days since Ash Wednesday to this day of rest and gladness, our regular, weekly, slightly subdued celebration of the resurrection of our Lord. So how are you doing? Or did you not know that Lent would be a challenge, a time for change, conversion, and renewal? One thing that must constantly be addressed is for the faith we confess with our mouths to be the faith we live with our actions.

St. Peter was to learn that "talking the talk" ("You are the Christ") was to be reflected in "walking the walk" ("deny yourself, take up your cross, follow Me"). And at the first indication that Peter didn't "get it," he was called back to repentance in no uncertain or gentle terms. At the same time we need to watch that our straying "walk" doesn't redefine or change the original "talk," the confession of the truth of Jesus.
