
THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT March 21st, 2021 10:00 AM





AS WE GATHER As we come closer to the goal of our Lenten journey, this Fifth Sunday has us pause and consider the basis of our hope. It has everything to do with our identity – who we are. Of ourselves, of course, we are hopeless. For as much as we try to cover up or make changes for the better, sin holds us captive. The only true hope comes from the new identity given to us by our baptism into Christ. As He identified with us so completely, even to the point of dying our death, so now our identity is completely awash in the grace of Christ who came not to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many. This, then, is how others should identify us, as servants of Christ (1 Corinthians 4:1) and of one another.

THE LORD'S SUPPER is the participation in the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the New Covenant, whose blessings are received through faith. This is a meal for those who comprehend the mystery of the Supper through instruction in God's Word and who can then publicly confess their unity of faith with us at the altar. If you are not a member of one of our sister congregations, please speak with Pastor during the week before communing. We truly want you to receive the Sacrament to your benefit and God's glory!
