As We Gather Those who accompanied Jesus into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday were people who wanted a king in the style of their hopes and dreams. Instead they got a King who was determined to go to the cross and conquer our foes of sin, death, and the devil. Because He was obedient to death, the Father highly exalted Him, at whose name "every knee should bow" (*Philippians 2:10*). Although the praises of Palm Sunday seem to be in contrast to the sorrow of Jesus' Passion, it is by His suffering that He became the King worthy of eternal praise. Today's worship focuses on the servant nature of our King.

Procession with Palms - Stand and face the back of the church.

Stand - Invocation

- **P** In the name of the Father and of the

 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- P It is Palm Sunday, when our Lord entered Jerusalem on the Sunday before His death and resurrection. Centuries before our Lord came to earth the Holy Spirit inspired the prophet Zechariah to write about the coming of our King.

Processional Gospel

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 12th chapter.
- **G** Glory to You, O Lord.
 - The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out,
 - Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!
 - P And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt! His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. The crowd that had been with Him when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised Him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign. So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him."
 - **P** This is the Gospel of the Lord.
 - Praise to You, O Christ.
