
AS WE GATHER Sundays are not counted among the forty days of Lent. They are always "little Easters," a sort of weekly rest stop on our way to Holy Week. In today's Gospel Jesus clears space in the temple, as if making room for God, calling people to God's invitation of grace. In today's Old Testament we hear the Ten Commandments. On this Third Sunday in Lent the Third Commandment stands out: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." To "remember" means to see God at work bringing His grace and blessing. "Sabbath" means to stop---everything, it is a "stop day." Holiness means being alive; whereas sin means separation and death. So what if we take God at His Word (Third Commandment) right now? Ready? Remember: Listen to the Word of the Lord. Stop; listen; and receive.
