Psalm 31 (Selected)

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven; whose sin is covered. Blessed is the one against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit, there is no deceit.
- Gracious Lord Jesus, You have told us that if we desire to be your disciples, we must take up our cross and follow You. Yet, all too often we have been embarrassed by Your cross and have failed to walk in Your ways. By the sins we pursue

and by our failure to do what is right, we are guilty of living as enemies of Your cross. We deserve Your temporal and eternal punishment. But You, O Lord, have carried our sins in Your body on the cross, so we turn to You in sorrow and repentance that we may be forgiven, die to sin, rejoice in our sufferings for Your sake, and live to the glory of Your Holy name. Amen.

In Christ Jesus, all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Christ, God reconciled all things, on earth and in heaven to Himself, making peace by the blood of Christ's cross. You, who once were alienated from God because of your sin, He forgives by His death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before Him. Upon this your confession, I by virtue of my office as a called and ordained servant of Christ, in His stead and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

SERVICE OF THE WORD

FIRST READING / Corinthians 1:18-25

¹⁸ The word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." ²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach[b] to save those who believe. ²² For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ

crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

SECOND READING

Mark 15:16-32

²¹ A certain man from Cyrene, Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and they forced him to carry the cross. ²² They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means The Place of the Skull). ²³ Then they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. ²⁴ And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get.

²⁵ It was the third hour when they crucified him. ²⁶ The written notice of the charge against him read: THE KING OF THE JEWS. ²⁷ They crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left. ²⁹ Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads and saying, "So! You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in three days, ³⁰ come down from the cross and save yourself!"

³¹ In the same way the chief priests and the teachers of the law mocked him among themselves. "He saved others," they said, "but he can't save himself! ³² Let this Christ, this King of Israel, come down now from the cross, that we may see and believe." Those crucified with him also heaped insults on him.


